



Are you hesitant to buying pre-owned products?















I'm not sure, honestly.


Furniture. I don't know people's living habits.

Why do you think pre-owned products cost less than brand new ones?









If they are reputable they would want to keep customers coming therefore offering continual good customer service would be important

At a larger chain like Best Buy or Gamestop it would be counter productive to business. If word got out that these chains intentionally sold shoddy merchandise it would blow up on social media and cause a stir among customers. People would stop purchasing merchandise from them and they would begin to lose business. Even independent sellers on eBay have ratings. If they're too low, customers don't even bother.

Usually retailers are run by corporate offices, which have rules about pre-owned products

I would hope that they make the same decisions that I do, and selling a defective product is against my personal ethics

Hopefully they are concerned about their reputation and credibility

This would damage the reputation of the company. With social media, this wouldn't go over well and would ultimately damage the company.

Most retailers have either stated that they will not except returns or pre owned items, and I would not buy it unless the price was too good to pass up, or they do accept returns of pre owned items, in which case I can then return it and try another pre owned or use it as credit towards the same product in new condition.

Reputation, you can bring up a bad brand

Bad reviews are a strong deterrent and the item will most likely be returned anyways


Most places I buy used products have a money back return policy for this issue. Plus it severely hurts reputation.


Companies are not malicious entities looking to scam its customers, they want to gain their loyalty and have them come back to spend more money, not a one off item scam
